- Monitor learner progress and provide constructive feedback.
- Assist with assessments, marking and record-keeping.
- Assist with the management and care of the teaching animals alongside the Large Animal Technician and Clinical Skills Team
- Participate in the out of hours rota providing care for the teaching animals outside of teaching times.
- Drive farm machinery and minibuses as required.
